Merry Christmas! Christmas will be with us for quite a while yet. The “High” Christmas season runs from Christmas Day through the Feast of the Epiphany (remember the Twelve Days of Christmas?). But, we know that the Christmas Season itself ends with The Purification of The Virgin Mary, or Candlemas. This is also the day when Our Lord was presented in the temple.

This bulletin issue will be finished and put on the website by 1 January, The Circumcision of the Lord, The Octave Day of Christmas, or Mary the Mother of God. Three days later, this Sunday, we celebrate the Most Holy Name of Jesus. Two days after that, The Epiphany, and next Sunday commemorated The Holy Family. Not a bad line-up, I’d say. By the way, I remind you that I will bless Epiphany Water and gold, frankincense and myrrh at 4:00 PM Monday, 5 January.
