Dear Community Members,

This Sunday, 25 January, is the last Sunday after Epiphany. This year, we have only three Sundays following the Epiphany. There is provision for six Sundays, but, of course, the date of Easter determines how many of those Sundays in a given year there actually are. Since we use three this year, the final three are available for use prior to the 24th and last Sunday after Pentecost. This is how the Church “fills out” Her post-Pentecostal season until it ends on the Saturday preceding the First Sunday of Advent. This year, since All Saints falls on a Sunday, She will only use the 5th and 6th Sundays after Epiphany in November.

Easter falls on 5 April, not too early nor too late. But more about Lent and Easter as we approach them more closely.

As I mentioned last Sunday, it’s good to be back. That’s not to say that my time at home was unpleasant. On the contrary, it was wonderful to be back home for a little while. I was able to get together with my college roommates and with my “music friends” as I call them. But the most important thing during my time away was that I was able to see a great deal of my sister. She and her family came to my home Saturday, the 10th for a brunch – which lasted until 8:00 PM. She and her husband and I went out for dinner the following evening. Though she has “good days” and “bad days” as I’m sure you can imagine, she has vastly improved since I saw her here last October. I remind you that we still have Epiphany Water, so stock up. Then, we have just a week before we enter our pre-Lenten Septuagesima season, my children and my friends.
