### Dear Community Members,

We're now into the season of Septuagesima. This past Monday, we celebrated Candlemas, aka The Feast of the Purification of Our Lady. As promised we began with the candle blessing in the Marian Room and then processed into church for the Sung Mass. The feast was celebrated beautifully and I thank all concerned. It takes work to set stuff up in a location other than the church. I only wish that there were more of you on hand to celebrate this most lovely feast.

I blessed throats again Tuesday for the Commemoration of St. Blaise. I'm glad I made the decision to bless throats on Sunday, since not many were able to make it to Mass Tuesday. St. Blaise was Bishop of Sebaste in Armenia who was martyred in the time of Licinius in about A.D 316. All particulars of his life rest on legendary acts and old traditions bound up with the veneration of saints in the liturgy of the Church. However, by this very fact, even though various "wags" might want to do away with saints like Blaise, these legends and acts are never to be absolutely rejected.

According to the legend Blasius was a physician at Sebaste before he was raised to the episcopal see. At the time of the persecution under Licinius he was taken prisoner at the command of the governor, Agricolaus. The hunters of the governor found him in the wilderness in a cave to which he had retired and while in prison he performed a wonderful cure of a boy who had a fishbone in his throat and who was in danger of choking to death. After suffering various forms of torture St. Blasius was beheaded; the Acts relate also the martyrdom of seven women. Stuff of legends? We need more of such legends.

It's now the time to think about renewed participation in CASA, the Catholic Arkansas Sharing Appeal. We had a very good showing last year, reaching about 170% of our goal. It is my earnest hope that we will not only match last year's performance but that we will do it with efforts of more than only nine community members.

I end with asking for more prayers for my sister. She experienced a setback last week. Family is so precious, my children and my friends.
