Dear Community Members,

Even though it's only a bit more than a week, I want to wish you a fruitful Lent. I hope everything's going well for you. This "soon to be past" week, we once again have Ember Days. Wednesday, Friday and Saturday are the Ember Days of Lent. With the exception of Friday which is complete abstinence from meat, Ember Wednesday and Saturday are days of fasting and partial abstinence. This means that only one full meal is permitted. Two small "collations" are permitted, provided that, together, they do not amount to another full meal. Meat is permitted at one meal or collation. The rules of fasting are binding on Catholics from between the ages of 18 and 59. All of this said, children, particularly small children are not bound to the rules of fasting. Another cautionary note, if one has special dietary restrictions, for example, diabetics, rules of fasting, if they contradict doctor's orders, are also not binding.

This past week, we celebrated the feast of The Chair of St. Peter. Due to weather, our celebration was, let's say, small. I was the only one at Mass last Monday. Such things are understandable down here in the South. You don't have the infrastructure to take care of heavy winter conditions. Northerners are used to such weather.

Gosh, 2015 is certainly speeding along. This Sunday is the first day of March! Before we know it, we'll soon be preparing for Christmas 2015! With the exception of the feasts of St. Joseph and The Annunciation, vestments at Mass will be purple. There is actually a particular Mass for every weekday in the season of Lent. Though I don't know for sure, I'd wager that, up until the reform of the Roman Missal under Pope St. Pius V, there was also a particular Mass for every day of Advent as well. This is the case in the Ordinary Form. With all of those Masses and the various cycles for Sundays and weekdays, it's no wonder that there are so many books. There is much wisdom in having our one year cycle. It also means fewer books!

To close, I'd like to reiterate what I said last Sunday about Stations of the Cross. I know of no better devotion than the Stations – particularly during the season of Lent. Stations, particularly the version we use – St. Alphonsus define Lent like nothing else. Try to walk in Our Lord's footsteps on Fridays, my children and my friends.
