Easter Week Schedule:

Wednesday, April 1, 6:00 pm Mass followed by Tenebrae (7:00 pm – 9:00 pm).

Holy Thursday, April 2, 7:00 pm Sung Mass with Mandatum (Foot Washing), Procession to Altar of Repose, Stripping of altars, and Compline.

Good Friday, April 3, 9:00 am – 10:45 am Tenebrae, 3:00 pm Solemn Liturgy and Compline.

Holy Saturday, April 4, 9:00 am – 10:30 am Tenebrae in rectory chapel, and 10:30 pm Paschal Vigil and Sung Mass at midnight.

Easter Sunday, April 5, 7:00 am Low Mass and 11:00 am Sung Mass.

Mass Schedule: There will be NO Masses offered on Easter Monday (April 6) and Tuesday (April 7). Father Magiera will be away for a meeting on April 13, 14, 15, and 16. Dear Community Members,

This Sunday begins the period known as Holy Week, the holiest week of the year. Sunday you will receive blessed palms and, at the 11AM Mass, process solemnly to the church. *In persona Christi*, I will strike the door three times with the processional cross, to seek entry into the church, symbolizing Our Lord's entry into Jerusalem. This year, I will not ride an ass, as I did last year, and there will be no deacon or subdeacon. The FSSP is not blessed with as many deacons this year, so I will be celebrating Holy Week services alone. This means I will chant the Passions according to St. Matthew and St. John by myself. True, this is not the best liturgical practice, but so long as the rule holds that no one not in Holy Orders may chant the various roles in the Passions, I must go it alone. In the interest of time, I will not preach on Palm Sunday.

Thursday, we will enter the Upper Room with Our Lord for The Mass of the Supper of the Lord (*Missa in Cena Domini*). Again, as Our Lord did, I will observe the *Mandatum* (the Commandment) by washing the feet of 12 men who represent the Apostles. Following the Mass, we will process with the Blessed Sacrament to the Altar of Repose in the rectory. Keeping vigil with Our Lord will be possible until midnight. Friday, we will observe the Solemn Liturgy which includes the Passion According to St. John, the veneration of the Cross, the various *Preces*, and the reception of Holy Communion. And, of course, on Holy Saturday, we will observe the Easter Vigil and Holy Mass. The Easter Sunday Masses follow our normal schedule.

There will be two special collections, one on Holy Thursday for diocesan seminarians and one on Good Friday for the Holy Land. The collection on Friday will not be taken formally, but there will be a collection basket at the rear of the church for your contributions.

Even though Holy Thursday, indeed all of Holy Week is "moveable," i.e., it nevertheless is the anniversary celebration of two important Sacraments, one, of course, the Most Important, the other linked by necessity. I refer to the institution of the Blessed Sacrament and also the Sacrament of Holy Orders. Though the former is prior in the absolute sense, in that all of the other Sacraments look to It for their efficacy, Holy Orders is prior in the order of things. We must always remember that there is no Holy Eucharist without the Priesthood.

But, all culminates in our celebration of Our Lord's Resurrection. As St. Paul tells us in I Corinthians 15: 14, "And if Christ be not risen again, then is our preaching vain, and your faith is also vain." But we know that our faith is not vain, my children and my friends.
