Dear Community Members,

Once again, a Happy and Blessed Easter to you. We are still in the Octave of Easter, a first class octave. Even after this octave, the Easter Season Endures until Pentecost. The time from Ascension Thursday to Pentecost is called Ascensiontide, but is still considered part of the Easter Season. The hour of None, and the Saturday preceding Pentecost closes the Easter Season.

Do you remember that thing called our “Easter Duty?” It’s a Church discipline that instructs us, under pain of mortal sin, to receive Holy Communion (at least) once during the Easter Season. NB, for the Easter Duty, one has from the first Sunday of Lent through Pentecost Sunday. Needless to say, I’m pretty sure no one from this community has to worry about fulfilling an Easter Duty. But, if I’m wrong here, now is the time to start doing something about it.

Holy Week was wonderful, wasn’t it. Our choir/schola and servers were pretty good, right? Well, I wonder if many of you know what it takes to give proper reverence and beauty to Holy Week. It’s not something that just “happens.” It takes work and dedication. And such things pay off so well in the end. A big thank you once again to all, many and some who worked so hard to make Holy Week and Easter such wonderful blessing.

This coming week, we get back into the normal routine of the Liturgical Year, i.e., specifically, the Sanctoral Cycle. That means we go back to celebrating saints’ feast days. You remember, of course, that, except for St. Joseph and The Annunciation, all weekdays in Lent had their own specific Masses. Ditto for Easter Week. But now, our great Saints, having been “uncovered,” come to the fore again. This week we can look forward to St. Hermengild and St. Justin Martyr, and in the coming weeks, St. Anselm, St. Mark the Evangelist and St. Catherine of Siena. I remind you all again that this coming week, I will be out of town, at the spring meeting of FSSP priests. I’ll be leaving Sunday afternoon and returning Friday afternoon. So, even though I will celebrate Mass (in Nebraska) for stated intentions, there will be NO Mass celebrated HERE Monday through Thursday, 13 through 16 April.
