Dear Community Members,

This Sunday is the last Sunday after Easter. We will soon be entering Ascension Tide. This begins, of course, with the great Feast of the Ascension, the event perfecting the Paschal Mystery, Our Lord's return to the Father.

Following the gospel on Ascension Thursday, the Paschal is extinguished, symbolizing that Our Lord is now no longer physically on earth. Mystically, of course, He still is. This is yet another example of how our Faith, the True Faith, is anchored in physical reality, elevating it by means of grace. It makes no sense to us that, in the Ordinary Form, the Paschal Candle is lighted at Mass up until the Feast of Pentecost. Our Lord has returned to the Father at His Ascension to send the Paraclete to us. This Paraclete will bring His own type of fire, one that will cleanse believers of ignorance and enlighten them to the Truth of truths. This time between Ascension and Pentecost is the first "novena" of the New Law.

Last Monday, we celebrated the Feast of St. Monica, mother of St. Augustine. It is in her honor that we pray our First Saturday devotion every month. And who appeared on the calendar the following day? None other than Pope St. Pius V who, in his Encyclical, *Quo Primum*, established the Roman Rite of Mass as the standard worship of the Church in perpetuity. We should thank God that, after a somewhat shaky and decades-long hiatus, the "Mass of the Ages" has returned to Its rightful spot in our worship. Speaking of Pope St. Pius V, I had the singular honor to celebrate Mass in his burial chapel in the great Basilica of St. Mary Major in Rome. What a beautiful chapel. I look forward to returning there someday soon.

Our guest from last Sunday, Father Damian O'Connell, SJ, very much enjoyed his time with us. You remember I told you that he came to baptize Cynthia Heather Bell, second daughter of James and Karen Bell, our newest Catholic and community member, to date, that is. There will be several more little ones born to the Church and to this community in the ensuing weeks.

Anyway, Father just couldn't compliment us, our community and the celebration of Mass enough last week. He left here very impressed by you in the pews, as well as our cracker-jack servers and wonderful choir and schola. I'm sure he'll have some stories to tell when he returns to New York. In the meantime, we can all remain here and enjoy the gifts God gives us day after day, my children and my friends.
