Dear Community Members,

We're now into the second half of September. True to my recent predictions, last week, not only did I start seeing advertisements for "Halloween," but I also saw more than one advertisement for Walmart's Christmas (see, it still slips out), I mean "holiday" layaway plan. Yikes! What a world!

Last week, you may have noticed a bit of a "gaff" in the bulletin, specifically for this past Monday's Mass time. The civic holiday Mass time slipped by my last proof read. I was approached to verify the normal, 7:15 Mass time. Should that ever happen again, always know that the normal Mass schedule is the rule. Again, the only time the schedule changes is when there is a public holiday. Our custom on such days is that there is one Mass, at 9:00 AM. And, our schedule expands to two Masses on a holy day of obligation or on a major feast, usually of the first class. This will happen at the end of this month for the Feast of St. Michael the Archangel. It falls on a Tuesday this year. So, there will be Mass at the normal Tuesday time, i.e., 7:15 AM, but there will be an additional Mass, a Sung Mass, at 6:00 PM.

It might be a good idea to spell out special days through the end of 2015: There is one major civic holiday remaining, i.e., Thanksgiving, Thursday, 26 November. There will be one Mass that day at 9:00 AM. Please note that there will be NO Mass Friday, 27 November. The only holy day of obligation is Tuesday, 8 December – the Immaculate Conception. There will be Low Mass at 7:15 AM and Sung Mass at 6:00 PM. Since the Feast of All Saints falls on Sunday, Masses will, of course, follow the normal Sunday schedule.

I'm sure you'll agree that The Commemoration of All Souls and Christmas are special cases. For All Souls Day, we will follow the schedule that I set two years ago: Low Masses at 7:15 AM and Noon; Solemn (hopefully) Mass at 6:00 PM. We will, of course, have Sung Midnight Mass for Christmas with Masses on Christmas Day following our normal Sunday schedule. For the Octave of Christmas, there will be no midnight Mass, of course, but we will follow our normal Sunday schedule on 1 January 2016.

Please remember that this Sunday, there is a second collection for "Catechetical Sunday." And, for those of you who were not prepared for last week's second collection for Our Lady of Guadalupe Seminary, you may still contribute to that by placing your assigned envelope or other specially marked envelope in either collection this Sunday. Your generosity over the last few months has been remarkable. I'll soon have to turn over statistics to the FSSP for the months of September and October. I'd love to knock their eyes out this year with such consistent numbers for that period, my children and my friends.
