Dear Community Members,

Well, I wouldn't call the rectory a hotel, but, we're having our share of guests. As you must remember, Father Berg was here for a "Canonical Visit" at the beginning of the month. He arrived All Saints evening and left prior to the Sung Mass on All Souls Day. Tonight, as I write this (it's Tuesday), Father Orłowski and I are awaiting the arrival of a good friend of ours – particularly of mine – Father Michael McCaffrey.
