Dear Community Members,

I write this the day after Candlemas. I'm sure that all of those in attendance at Candlemas will agree that the ceremonies and Mass were simply beautiful. I was also very pleased at the attendance. On this "non-obligation" Holy Day, the attendance was 56. Very good, I'd say.

There certainly were a lot of candles, weren't there? I tried to anticipate our need and purchase enough candles to last us, well, at least, until Candlemas 2017. I'm also very glad that many brought candles to be blessed for use in your homes.

Well, this Sunday is it, the last Sunday before Lent. I remind you that there will be three Masses on Ash Wednesday and ashes will be imposed at each of those Masses. The Mass times, also specified in this bulletin, are 7:15 AM, 12:00 Noon, **7:00 PM**. I remember telling you that, apart from Ash Wednesday and the Immaculate Conception, all 2016 evening Masses will be at 6:00 PM. So, yes, St. Patrick will have Mass at 6:00 PM.

As I specified recently in the bulletin, I will be away from 11 February through 17 February. I will be in Chicago. I have the honor to be the tenor soloist in a recording of W.A. Mozart's Requiem with The Society of St. John Cantius. The Master died before he completed this work. Though not a big, full-blown, commercial recording, this final masterpiece of Mozart will feature orchestra members from the Chicago Symphony and the Chicago Lyric Opera. I will be in very good company and it will be great, at least for a short time, to get back into the professional life I freely set aside years ago for something much better, my priesthood. However, God, in His Goodness, has permitted me this brief musical pleasure. Of course, Father Orłowski will see to the Mass schedule.

I also have another piece of good news for you: Our Lady of Guadalupe Seminary has kindly agreed to send us a deacon for Holy Week. Deacon Joseph Favole will arrive Friday before Palm Sunday and stay with us until Easter Monday. This way, all of our ceremonies and Masses will be solemn and the Passions can be chanted properly, unlike last year when I had to do all three parts myself. I've also been told that Deacon Favole is a fabulous cook.

My sister is doing very well. Medically, she's 100%. However, she still has a long way to go in terms of rehab and regaining appetite and physical energy. I know you'll keep on praying for her, my children and my friends.
