Dear Community Members,

It's official. We're now in Lent. I write this on Ash Wednesday, so I know I'm right. Those of you who were at Mass any time Ash Wednesday should have noticed something new – our Lenten candlesticks. There is a complete set of wood candlesticks, six High Mass Candlesticks, two Low Mass candlesticks, two Acolyte candlesticks, one Sanctus candlestick and an extra for good measure. The Church's vesture even including those articles on Her altars, should reflect the austerity of this penitential season. They were hand made by Mr. Ken Lipsmeier. Mr. Lipsmeier is also the man who made the three podia we use for the Holy Week Passions and the *Tenebræ* Hearse, the large candelabrum you must have seen last year and which you'll see again. Mr. Lipsmeier is a very talented and generous man whom I met through the Missionaries of Charity. He is so generous that the only compensation he accepted for the *Tenebræ* Hearse was the cost of materials. He charged us nothing for the podia or the candlesticks. We owe it to him to keep him in our prayers. I think he also knows that I have a number of other projects for him in the future. Oh, by the way, these candlesticks will also be used for funerals, though, thank God, we have precious few of them.

You know I will not see you this weekend. I'll have left for Chicago Thursday, 11 February. I'll be celebrating Valentine's Day at St. John Cantius. As I mentioned in last week's letter, I'll be one of the soloists in a recording of the Mozart Requiem St. John Cantius is producing. As it was with their recording of The Rosary a few years ago, this recording will also be a fund-raiser. At the moment, I don't know the cost, but, I'm sure that, if you wish, you'll be able to purchase it through Biretta Books ([birettabooks.com](http://birettabooks.com)) in a month or two.

It is this Sunday (or today, depending on when you read this letter) that Lent really gets into full swing. True, it began on Ash Wednesday, but the first Sunday of Lent puts the season into high gear.

Many churches make quite a big deal about abstinence and fasting during Lent. Happily, we're very well versed in that area. If, however, you're uncertain, you have but to ask Fr. Orlowski or myself, refer to the FSSP Ordo, if you have one, or refer to your FSSP calendar. But, short and sweet, though abstinence from meat every Friday of the year is still "on the books" in the Code of Canon Law, in the US it is obligatory on Ash Wednesday and every Friday in Lent. Fasting only on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. I wish you a fruitful Lent, my children and my friends.
