Dear Community Members,

We now begin the most solemn part of Lent, known as Passiontide. This little “sub-season” begins with First Vespers (late Saturday afternoon) of Passion Sunday. It is on this Saturday that all crucifixes and statues in the church are covered. This goes for images in the vestibule as well. No, it is not necessary that you cover crucifixes or images in your homes.

This custom reflects, allegorically, what is put forth at the end of the gospel for Passion Sunday, when the Jews were about to stone Him: “*Jesus autem abscondit se, et exiit de templo.*” But Jesus hid Himself and went out of the temple. Our Lord hid Himself. Hence, crucifixes are veiled. But, if Our Lord hid Himself, why should his saints be visible? At one time, statues were removed from the churches. Since this is impractical, for the most part, the custom for Passiontide is to veil statues and images, with the exception of the Stations of the Cross and stained glass windows. These customs show how Holy Mother Church never ceases teaching.

Lent is certainly flying by, isn't it? After today, Sunday, we will only have two more weeks until the Resurrection. Next week begins Holy Week with the solemn blessing and distribution (simple blessing and distribution @ 7:00 AM) of palms and procession to the church for Solemn Mass. Please be aware that we will begin the ceremony for the blessing of palms at 10:30 AM – as has been our custom – in the school parking lot.

This Holy Week will be blessed with solemn ceremonies. All liturgies from Palm Sunday through Easter Sunday will be solemn, i.e., with celebrant, deacon and subdeacon. Rev. Mr. Joseph Favole, from Our Lady of Guadalupe Seminary will be our guest for the week, after having only recently been ordained to the transitional diaconate. He will serve as deacon all week as is his privilege. This means that when I am celebrant, Father Orłowski will serve as subdeacon. When he is celebrant, I will be subdeacon.

I remind you to pay great attention to the schedule of Holy Week services. Apart from Masses and the like, we will once again pray Tenebræ on Wednesday night and Good Friday and Holy Saturday mornings. One more surprise: Solemn Mass on Divine Mercy Sunday with Rev. Mr. Ed Brodsky serving as deacon. He will also be here later in the year to celebrate one of his first Solemn Masses. More later, my children and my friends.
