Dear Community Members,

Yes, Father's back and quite a bit browner than he was when he left. Don't worry, that will quickly fade. As nice as the vacation was, I'm very glad to be back with you. Sun and sand are wonderful, as are the comforting, warm waters of the Gulf of Mexico, but when that respite is over, well, it's over.

I attended Mass at the FSSP Apostolate in Sarasota, Christ the King. I did not celebrate Mass there, though I did sit in choir. Apparently, priests have to jump through a myriad of hoops in order to minister in the Diocese of Venice, even if one is merely a guest and there for only a short time. I'd have to go through a background check and get fingerprinted – in addition to producing the normal vetting documents from the FSSP! All just to celebrate Mass, preach and hear confessions. Well, it was easier just to sit in choir. Besides, there are three priests there and they didn't need my help.
