Dear Community Members,

By this time, most of you will already know that there will be no community meeting as such during the brunch. However, it will still be "full speed ahead" on the brunch. Prior to his arrival, Father Saguto informed me that, even though he planned to spend several days with us, something quite urgent forced him to curtail his visit. So, he was only able to give us two, short, yet, fully packed days. While he was here, we visited St. Joseph Orphanage (again), another property I have had my eye on for months, which I'll talk about, at some point, and we had another meeting with our very own and beloved "numbers crunchers," Scott and Jennifer Harmon. Both Father and I apologize very much for the disappointment his absence causes. But, going on...

Last Sunday's 11:30 Mass attendance was very poor. This is quite disappointing since, over the last few weeks, I made a point of telling you that, as he does every year, the bishop wants attendance figures for all Masses during the month of October. Unfortunately, we hit a new low, for us anyway. We're back at 2014 levels. Attendance has been slowly eroding at the 11:30 over the past few weeks, but I hoped that it would rally after reminding you of the importance of attendance numbers in October. We had 95 last Sunday. The last time the number was so low was in December of 2014 with 92. Prior to that was 99 in August of 2014, 70 in March, 88 and 90 in January 2014.

Of course, from time to time there are scheduling snags. Once in a while it's just really necessary to go to the early Mass. And, sometimes, air-conditioning problems almost force us to go to the "cool" Mass. In fact, the 7AM Mass is showing respectable numbers lately, and yes, it works out that, proportionally, the monetary contribution at the 7AM is greater than the 11:30 AM. It always has. All of this is quite wonderful, indeed. But, we all know that there is really no reason for two Sunday Masses here. Our numbers don't justify two Masses. Two or three times a year, we might hit 200 over both Masses combined. But, this church seats 500. So even on a big attendance day, it still looks empty. There is also something else to consider: Instead of "getting Mass over with" so you can enjoy the rest of the day, there is a great deal to be said for making Mass the true "CENTER PIECE" of your Sunday, to build your day around the Mass, in terms of joyful anticipation, participating in Mass as a member of the greater worshipping community, and then relaxing in the company of Our Lord and your family as they day fades to a close. While hoping that the 7AM Mass numbers remain respectable, let's consider improving our numbers at the 11:30AM, particularly on these last four Sundays in October, when numbers are very important to the chancery "powers," my children and my friends.
