Dear Community Members,

I write this on Wednesday, 18 February, Ash Wednesday. By now, I hope that all of you can walk and drive about easily, without fear of wiping out on ice. We were very fortunate this past weekend in that the dreadful weather kindly waited until Sunday night to start. Things were pretty much paralyzed Monday. On Tuesday, at least in the North Little Rock environs, ice melted quickly and streets were clear enough to drive. I hope that none of you sustained any injuries or inconvenience during the past week's cold snap.

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of our Lenten journey. Knowing you as I do, faithful, traditional Catholics, I trust that you've given a lot of thought as to what your Lenten penance would be. If you plan to give up something, the essence of the penance is that you give up an intrinsic good, something that has, in itself, no trace of evil. Knowing that, as we do, I imagine many of you have given up something like a favorite food, a favorite beverage, a favorite diversion or some such thing. Perhaps, instead, you've added something instead like scripture or spiritual reading or perhaps an extra daily Rosary. All of this is very commendable. What we have to ensure is that our penance is our own and no one else's. Better NOT to give up something rather than to make others pay for your penance abstinence.

We must also remember that giving up something intrinsically evil in no way fulfills a Lenten penance. One cannot give up gossiping or lying, for instance, and think he/she is doing something meritorious. During Lent, the laws of abstinence from meat are more binding than they are the rest of the year. One must abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays, especially Good Friday. However, it's also a good thing to recall that Sundays and First Class Feasts allow us a break from our penances. During Lent this year, First Class Feasts are 2/23, St. Peter's Chair (for FSSP apostolates), and the Feasts of St. Joseph 3/19 and The Annunciation 3/25.

Don't forget that we add something special to our devotional life during Lent. I refer to the Stations of the Cross. We will have Stations every Friday except Good Friday. Stations are one of the many things we can do to show God our love, my children and my friends.
