Dear Community Members,

Though there will be a few welcome exceptions in the liturgical calendar in the upcoming weeks, we are now in that time known as The Season after Pentecost. Our Ordinary Form friends know it as, well, “Ordinary Time.” The predominant color will be green, at least on most Sundays, but the exceptions I alluded to above will include: The External Solemnity of Corpus Christi (this Sunday), The External Solemnity of Ss. Peter and Paul (28 June), and Christ the King (28 October).

I remind you that this Sunday is a most important day for three young lady community members: Miss Genevieve McCann, Miss Rebecca Yakoubian and Miss Gemma Ross. They will process in with me, receive their First Holy Communion in a very special way at the high altar, and process with me in the Corpus Christi procession which is “tacked on” to the end of Mass. As usual, we will have our three external altars at which Benediction will take place, with a final Benediction back at the high altar. Of course, we will have a reception for our special young ladies in the gym, where I will invest them with the scapular.

Again, I wish to thank all of you who came to my anniversary celebration and sent cards and gifts. A very special thank you to those who worked so hard cleaning, decorating, cooking, serving and cleaning up. You all came together heroically for your unworthy yet devoted chaplain.

A word about our new assistant: Father Orlowski will be joining us rather soon. In fact, I expect him to arrive on 12 or 13 June. Father will serve as my assistant, of course. It will be good to finally have some community life. Father Orlowski also serves as one of the Fraternity’s “swing priests.” That is, he fills in for other priests who need to be away from their communities, for example, for vacations. As such, Father is paid by FSSP Headquarters and will not be compensated by our community. This is not at all unusual. We, of course, will provide room and board for him, which will not be a significant burden on our community in any way. In fact, Father’s presence here will actually be a boon, since I will no longer have to pay for a substitute when I go away. There will also be no significant schedule changes or additions while Father is with us.

We rejoice at his coming. You’ll now have two priests to love and care for you, my children and my friends.
