Dear Community Members,

As you all know I am the new assistant for the Latin Mass community and have been here for two Sundays. I am not quite settled here and I still have some unpacking to do and some transition business to attend to. But my arrival is close to complete which is a relief because, you could say, I began my journey here many, many years ago...

It all began most likely when my two oldest brothers went to seminary in Seattle. I wasn't even born when it all began but I have vague recollections of going to visit the seminary before they both left. However, as my dad says, they almost lost the faith at the seminary.

Still, my third oldest brother and I still wanted to become priest but knew how distraught my parents were about my two oldest brothers' new view of religion. I remember my third oldest brother, discussing with my dad what other options there might be to become a priest. Over time my brother became frustrated with the groups he investigated. Finally I remember he took me for a walk to explain to me that he had decided to court a girl.

I, the fourth son, now thought it would be unfeasible to become a priest. Around the same time I was exposed to a Gregorian chant Latin Novus Ordo Mass which I liked but at the same time I realize that it would be difficult for a priest to make for a reverent Novus Ordo. He would be forced to say Mass in situations where the parishioners imposed sacrilegious practices on the Mass.

A few years later I began to be exposed to the traditional Mass. I didn't particularly like it because I had no idea what was going on and the celebrant did not always follow the rubrics. But I had a roommate in college who was very supportive of the traditional mass and I realized that the only way that I could become a priest was to say the traditional Mass, because I would otherwise not be able to prevent sacrileges.

News came that the fraternity had opened up a North American seminary, but I was cautioned by my spiritual director about entering the FSSP and I was waiting to get some sign that I had a vocation. It came to pass that after college this same roommate went to the fraternity seminary. He wrote me a letter based on conversations we had had. Although I did not realize it at the time, the letter changed the course of my life, my journey to Arkansas picked up speed.
