Dear Community Members,

St. John records our Lord “walked in Galilee” before the Passover. “For he would not walk in Judea, because the Jews sought to kill him.” His brethren were eager for the Judeans to see His works, but our Lord replies: “My time is not yet come; but your time is always ready.” The Arkansas summer tells us to slow things down and thankfully the church schedule saunters along too, but Catholics should always be ready to be good up to the practice of heroic virtue, which is appropriately shown by a willingness to die for the faith.

After I received a letter from a college roommate about vocation I knew that I could try my vocation, I did not have to be sure that I should become a priest or feel ready to be a priest. I was making the easier decision rather than making a hard commitment right away. Was I after all really competent, knowledgeable, to decide to pursue a priestly vocation to the end anyways?

I began to see with clarity that I should just try a vocation. Then I knew I should be thorough about my search. Finally, I had the conviction to pursue it to the end. This conviction proved very important in my case. I was going to make many false starts at my vocation but each time I surmised that I had taken the wrong path and that I should try another one rather than abandon the pursuit. Each time I gained invaluable knowledge which made it a lot easier when I finally entered the Fraternity of St. Peter seminary and am now here.

The first thing I did was continue to work! I was waiting for some opportunity to show itself. Well that did not work out too well. So when I got the invitation from an acquaintance, Joseph O’Hara, to travel and visit monasteries, I jumped at the opportunity. I visited at least six monasteries on a round trip from Washington, DC to the Norbertines in Orange County California. I did not think any of them were for me, but I was now in the habit of investigating monasteries wherever I traveled, offering to help out and asking to talk with the monks. The next stage I got together with the same Joseph O’Hara, who is now at Clear Creek, and with a future diocesan priest, Joseph Levine. Both had spent at least four years in religious life. We never got far with the project but all of us decide to join the diocese of Lacrosse, where the now famous Cardinal Burke was bishop. I gained some knowledge living at the rectory with a good priest. Next, Joseph Levine and I took a trip to visit a nascent religious group, which we joined two weeks later! This would prove invaluable for me.

Now, with God’s help, making the daily decision of life can make the impossible decision easy and even natural to us. So it is always “our time” to do good, because we have to be prepared to do the hard things at some point.
