Dear Community Members,

Well, I'm now going to give Father Orłowski a chance to preach and I'm going to take a breather for a while. For several weeks, with the exception of my vacation absence, Father has sat in the sedilia and listened to me preach at Masses he has celebrated in addition to the Masses I celebrated. Now, it's my turn to listen to him. I'm sure we'll all benefit from his preaching.

On September 29, we will celebrate the Feast of St. Michael the Archangel. **We will honor St. Michael with two Masses for his feast day. Since it's a Tuesday, the first Mass will be, of course, at the normal 7:15 AM time. The second will be a Sung Mass celebrated at 6:00 PM.** Last year, we had an informal "ice cream social" after Mass. This year will mark the start of a yearly tradition. It is also the feast of my patron Saint.

St. Michael was the champion of God who triumphed over the devil and his demonic minions at the beginning of creation. St. Michael could be regarded as the patron of the defenders of the Faith and of the Church. He serves as an example to all of us, particularly at this time of confusion, crisis and unrest both IN the Church and OUTSIDE the Church.

With regard to evil external forces, we merely have to look at the government, the sensationalist media, murderous terrorist actions in the Middle East, the butchering of babies and the selling of their body parts, the entire perverse phenomenon of political correctness. For evil internal forces, far worse than external forces, we have but to cast our eyes over the guest list our distinguished president has planned for the reception of the Holy Father at the White House: a tranny "activist," a sodomite Episcopal "bishop" (a layman who likes to play "dress-up"), two other homosexual, "Catholic" activists, and, yes, my friends, a "nun on the bus." The "nuns on the bus" graced our fair city of Little Rock on September 13, speaking at a Methodist church.

Messenger Michael Voris doesn't always get it 100% right and is, at times, a bit flinty – remember, he has been and still is a target of persecution himself – but he supports his statements with concrete references and documentation, including pronouncements from the four most recent popes (absent JP I), Ecclesia Dei and the CDF. The question of the SSPX and its future is still unclear, yet has promise. Let's pray that they return to full communion. Even though many bishops hesitate to use the word 'schism,' they will say that the SSPX has an "irregular" status. Many affiliated with the SSPX admit that they are not "with" the Church. There is even much disunity within the society itself. One bishop has been expelled from the SSPX, excommunicating himself – ironically, for doing what Archbishop Lefebvre himself did, viz., consecrating a bishop without a mandate. Whose mandate? Remember, as St. Ambrose said, "*ubi Petrus, ibi Ecclesia*" (where Peter is (even if some might not like today's Peter much), there is the Church). God bless you, my children and my friends.
