Dear Community Members,

Your chaplain is now a member of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre, a knight. I traveled to Austin, Texas, last weekend and was invested as a knight by His Grace, the Most Reverend Michael Sheehan, Archbishop Emeritus of Santa Fe. It was a most grand ceremony. I was inducted along with 14 other priests and one bishop and was vested with the mozetta on which was emblazoned the Jerusalem Cross. Investiture with the mozetta is unusual these days in the Southwestern Lieutenancy. The reason for that is that most priests concelebrate the Mass and are invested with a special stole. Since I do not concelebrate, and since the mozetta is “choir dress,” I was invested in that.

The Mass and ceremonies (there were two ceremonies, one on Saturday, for “promotees” to higher ranks, and one for investees) took place in St. John Neumann Church, and what a place that was. It’s rather new and “modern” but it was very nice modern, not ugly modern. It was a cavernous space with a large dome and the exterior showed very classical lines. The music was very well done, though some of it was more Protestant than Catholic.

None of our knight/lady community members were able to attend this year, but there were several from the Little Rock area and I made the acquaintance of several from Fort Smith. There were also a lot of miters in attendance, including that of Bishop Anthony Taylor. I returned to North Little Rock on Monday after a rather fully-packed and tiring weekend.

Next year’s ceremony will take place right here in Little Rock. At that time, our own James and Karen Bell will be inducted. If any of you are interested in knowing more about the Knights of the Holy Sepulchre, particularly with an eye to joining, I’d be happy to meet with you for a chat.

As I mentioned in last week’s letter, we lost our dear Carolyn Bruich. Because I had to be away, I was not able to celebrate her Requiem. I’m very grateful to Father Orłowski who, most admirably, stepped into the breach. Thanks also go out to Mr. Clayton and his schola and Mr. Pyron and our Knights of the Altar. Their efforts were even more heroic, since the Requiem did not take place here, but rather at St. Edward Church in Little Rock. Carolyn was quite attached to St. Edward Church. She was married there and received all of her Sacraments there. We’re also grateful to St. Edward Church and to Father Jason Tyler for receiving us with gracious hospitality.

This week, Father Orłowski and I were at the St. John Center for continuing clergy education. The diocese offers continuing education twice a year and all priests, diocesan and not, are expected to attend. The speaker this time is Father Leo Patalinghug. Father has appeared several times on EWTN with his program “Grace Before Meals.” He’s quite energetic and engaging.

This weekend will also be a rather busy one for some of us. Miss Kim Rees who was a member here, though unable to attend Mass here consistently, will be getting married in St. Mary of the Springs in Hot Springs. So, Father and I, again, along with Mr. Pyron and our Knight Servers and Mr. Clayton and his schola will again be “on the road.” Thereafter, I’ll be several days with my sister, whose condition remains unchanged. I know you understand that I want to spend time with her whenever possible.

I close by letting you know that, in November, I will be the featured speaker for Little Rock’s “Theology on Tap.” I hope I can provide an interesting evening for those attending. Perhaps I’ll see some of you there, my children and my friends.
