Some of you, perhaps many of you, will read this well in advance of Sunday. I'm counting on that and hoping that, if you haven't decided to help with the rummage sale, you will now. All of us must remember that proceeds from this rummage sale go to the Handmaids of the Lord. It is they who usually sponsor, prepare for, serve at and clean up after our second Sunday luncheons. And that's not all. This Sunday is the penultimate Sunday of the Church Year. It is the "Sixth Resumed Sunday after Epiphany. Next Sunday, the 24th and Final Sunday after Pentecost, the current Liturgical Year will draw to a close. It will end at the conclusion of the Office of None, i.e., about 3:30 PM, Saturday, 28 November.

Monsignor Malone's office notified us priests Tuesday that Father Venantius (Mike) Preske passed away. I didn't know Father, of course, but Monsignor Malone, in his communiqué, mentioned that Father Preske ministered to the Latin Mass Community of Mountain Home. We commemorate the dedication of three major basilicas this month: St. John Lateran, 11/9; St. Peter and St. Paul, 11/18. There is also a very important diocesan commemoration this month as well, that is, the Feast of St. Andrew, the diocesan patron, 11/30. It was also on this day that St. Andrew Cathedral was dedicated. However, due to the feast of St. Andrew, the cathedral dedication is transferred to 1 December. Perhaps some of you remember the cathedral in its former glory days. I imagine many also remember the sad, "wreckovation" period as well. If you haven't been to the cathedral since then, you'll be pleasantly surprised to see that it's been restored beautifully. I still find it quite surprising that our church seats about 150 more people than the cathedral!

Let's continue to enjoy the end of the Church year and the current beautiful weather, my children and my friends.
