Dear Community Members,

I write this letter to you Tuesday evening on a computer in the basement of the rectory of the Canons Regular of St. John Cantius. In a short while, I'll be helping my friend, Fr. Scott Haynes with a few things, but I thought I'd just take a moment to dash off this bulletin letter. These letters are one of my chief joys as your chaplain. And, as I've said before, I hope you enjoy reading them as much as I enjoy writing them.

Well, you all should remember that I traveled to Chicago to sing the tenor solos in St. John Cantius' recording of the Mozart Requiem. After I arrived last Thursday, Father Scott and I rehearsed a bit. Then there was a general piano rehearsal Saturday. The recording sessions began Sunday evening in the church. The Blessed Sacrament was removed and reposed in the sacristy for the duration of the recording.

I can't tell you how everything came flooding back and how natural and "on top" of things I felt, you know with singers behind me and an orchestra in front of me. It was so good to go back in time for a little while. My soloist colleagues were all top notch and the chorus was made up of area professionals. The orchestra was made up of instrumentalists from the Chicago Lyric Opera orchestra and from the Chicago Symphony. Can we all say great musicians? Yes we can, one and all. The orchestra numbered 31 players. Believe me, this will be a great recording. I expect it become available in May sometime.

While here, I had the good fortune to get together with my old friend Monsignor Schaedel from Indianapolis. Indy is only a three hour drive from Chicago, and Monsignor decided to visit St. John Cantius so he and I could have a little reunion. It was wonderful to see him. I miss him very much. I'll do my best to get him down to this neck of the woods. You'll really hear some good preaching then, I can tell you. My flight home is/was (depending on when you read this letter) Wednesday. I know that Father Orłowski took very good care of you in my absence.

Boy, will there be "interesting" times in the Archdiocese of Chicago over the next year. Plans are afoot to close and/or reorganize about 100 churches. When, during Mass, one church was informed about its closure by the "vicariate" bishop (one of the auxiliary bishops), there was nearly a riot. People leapt out of the pews and stormed the sanctuary. Well, that's Chicago for you. See you soon, my children and my friends.
