Dear Community Members,

It's been 15 years. Fifteen years since the "religion of peace" made it abundantly clear to us how vulnerable we really were and are; how much, despite what the talking heads in the government and the Church tell us, Islam hates the west, the United States and the Church in particular. After all, how many times have we heard that the IS will "conquer Rome?" And they will, if we let them!

I can remember that dreadful day very well. I was doing my "summer apostolate" work as a seminarian. Every Tuesday, I spent the entire day in a hospital complex in south Jersey. I was finishing up one particular job when my supervisor, a (pant-suited) Sister of St. Joseph informed me that an airplane had crashed into one of the Twin Towers. Quite frankly, I thought the polyester was causing her to have delusions. But when I entered one of the TV rooms, I saw that she was deadly serious. How horrible it was when the TV cameras caught the second plane crashing into the other tower!

It was all the worse for me because a dear friend I'd had since 1982, whom I visited and spent time with that previous weekend, lost her life in that dreadful event. That day changed America forever, and not necessarily for the better, unfortunately. Though we don't like to admit it, I'm sure, this country is still reeling and feeling the effects of that dreadful day. The shame of it is that now we're sort of desensitized. It doesn't register that fear is so much a part of our daily experience.

Thank you very much for your understanding about today's change of schedule. As I mentioned, Father Saguto wants to be a bit more involved in our present situation and, because of that, he's asked us to delay our community meeting. He plans to be here at the beginning of October and we'll see how he wants us to proceed.

But, still, today is kind of special. We begin our new cycle of "Second Sunday Brunches" today. It's always good when we can get together as a community after Mass and enjoy one-another's company. I particularly enjoy seeing all of our kids play together. I think it's quite important for those among you who have young children – and you are legion – to take our Sunday get-togethers seriously.

I remember, years ago, hearing – from a bishop, actually (go figure) – that "home-schooled" children simply just aren't properly socialized. Yeah, like he knew! Even bishops can be wrong. All one has to do is experience community gatherings like ours (and this is true all over the place) to see that our children have more on the ball socially than all or most mainstream kids. Hey, at least they aren't walking around in a dumb haze thumbing smart phones. Yeah, some socialization that is, right?

For the rest of the month? Father Orłowski will be traveling to Scranton to substitute and we end the month with the feast of St. Michael. Let's see how the scheduling for that works out, my children and my friends. Could be interesting.
