Dear Community Members,

For some reason, I do not know why, I will continue to be away from the apostolate a lot. It all started when I went away for just a Sunday at the end of July. Now it seems that I am gone on weekends almost more than I am here, being gone mostly over just one Sunday, except for the three weekends coverage that I recently did in Scranton. The priests of the Fraternity has always had my phone number, but they suddenly are contacting me to cover.

My recent trip to Scranton, PA was eventful. I decide to drive up to Pennsylvania so that I could visit my Mom on the way and have my own car for the whole time. Also packing for a long trip is easier if you have your own vehicle. She is now about an hour off the Interstate 81 in Northern Virginia. For the whole trip I only had to make one major turn from the I-40 onto the I-81. It was providential that my Mom was on the way to Scranton, PA. Many of you were able to meet her when she passed through as she was moving to Virginia. So now she is at her new place in Fredericksburg VA. I was able to see her new place and help her with a few things when I got there including working on a trust for her. I was able to stop on the way back from Scranton and tie up see some things through that I had started on the way up.

By the way, making a trust is a better option than a will. A trust is less likely to end up in litigation over inheritance. But a trust is particularly effective because you can have a plan for distributing your money over time to your children. It is a morally risky thing for children to inherit money all at once. It is better for them to have an income rather than have money that they might consume all at once.

My visit to our FSSP apostolate in Scranton was wonderful. It is nice to see and catch up with so many good friends at the parish there. St. Michael's like this apostolate has been there a long time and I have seen many families grow up in the apostolate over the years. It is a kind of mystery that we are all spread out all over the country. While I was there I was able to visit the North American headquarters of the FSSP which is twenty minutes from the parish. I was able to have dinner with Fr. Saguto who had just been here in Little Rock, the week before.

So I will be away again this weekend when you receive this bulletin. I will be covering in Tacoma, WA at our new apostolate there. A deacon who was serving there will be ordained a priest this weekend, Saturday October 22. I was born in Tacoma, WA but my family moved away from there in '78 and almost all our connection there have been lost. I will also be away the last two weekends of November. I think that I can safely say that I will not be away from here for quite a long time after that.
